The *UCLA Law Review* has published an article co-authored by Reid Chambers and Will Stephens, both partners in the Washington, D.C. office of the law firm of Sonosky, Chambers, Sachse, Endreson & Perry, LLP. The article, entitled *Principles of International Law That Support Claims of Indian Tribes to Water Resources*, 63 UCLA L. REV. 1530 (2016), discusses the growing body of international legal principles that recognize the right of indigenous people to water resources as a key component of their rights to self-determination, land, and economic self-sufficiency, and how those principles might be used to support a more comprehensive approach in the United States to address the unmet water needs of Tribes. The article appears in the August 2016 issue of the *UCLA Law Review*, which was dedicated entirely to matters of Federal Indian law, in honor of the work of Professor Carole E. Goldberg of the UCLA School of Law.
